GETTING TO THE EVENT

TRAVELLING BY PLANE

For an effortless journey to the Monaco Grand Prix, the most convenient way to travel is by air. Nice Côte d'Azur Airport, located just 30km from the iconic Circuit de Monaco, welcomes flights from across the UK and Europe. With several daily departures from London Heathrow, you could be soaking up the sun on the French Riviera in just two hours.

For racegoers traveling from further afield, there are excellent connections to Nice. Flights from the US often include a stopover in a European hub, but daily direct flights from New York's JFK International to Nice make the journey seamless. For travelers departing from other US cities, connecting flights via major European airports such as Barcelona, Copenhagen, and Lisbon ensure smooth onward travel to Nice, typically on the same day.

Upon arrival in Nice, your journey to Monte Carlo couldn't be simpler. The St. Augustin train station is just a 10-minute walk from the airport terminal. From there, direct trains whisk you to Monte Carlo, delivering you to the heart of the action in no time.

MONACO GRAND PRIX PARKING

It is highly recommended that you take the train to the Monaco Grand Prix on race weekend as the traffic will get very busy and, as it is a street circuit, many of the main roads in and around Monaco will be blocked.

TRAVELLING BY TRAIN

France is home to one of Europe's best connected train stations in Paris' Gare du Nord. Trains from London via Eurostar, and the Netherlands and Germany via Thalys all run to Paris, making is easy to access from across the continent.

Once arrived at Gare du Nord, high-speed trains will take you directly to the south of France in a matter of hours. You can travel directly to Nice before connecting to Monaco, or jump off to explore French cities such as Marseille, Toulon and Cannes.

When you finally arrive in Nice, SNCF run services towards Menton and Ventimiglia which stop at the Monaco-Monte Carlo station every half an hour, for as little as €4.

Our travel team can help you to buy tickets in advance to get them substantially cheaper.

TRAVELLING BY TAXI

Alternatively, buses are readily available to take you to Monaco. This is especially helpful if you decide to stay in Nice during the weekend, and travel into Monte Carlo for the event.

From La Port, the LR100 bus operates services towards Monaco which takes about 45 minutes to take you to the centre of Monaco for as little as €2.50 every 15 minutes.

GETTING TO THE EVENT



TRAVELLING BY CAR

Parking in Monaco during the race weekend can be incredibly challenging unless you have secured a hotel booking that includes parking facilities. Spaces are extremely limited, and the high demand can make parking a frustrating experience. Therefore, it is strongly recommended to leave your car in Nice and take advantage of alternative transport options.

If you're determined to drive, Monte Carlo is accessible via the A8 Motorway. The journey from Nice to Monaco typically takes about 40 minutes under normal traffic conditions. Follow these steps:

Take Exit 56 – Monaco from the A8 Motorway.
Follow the clearly marked signs directing you toward Monte Carlo.

However, be prepared for unexpected road closures and diversions, especially during the race weekend when major roads may be blocked to accommodate the event. Traffic congestion in and around Monte Carlo is also significant, so patience is essential. For a smoother experience, carefully plan your route in advance, monitor real-time traffic updates, and consider arriving early to avoid the most intense traffic periods.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW LONG IS THE MONACO GRAND PRIX?

The Monaco Grand Prix is much more than just a single race - it's a multi-day spectacle that offers an unforgettable experience for motorsport enthusiasts and visitors alike. While the main race typically lasts between 1.5 to 2.5 hours, depending on race conditions and unforeseen events, the excitement builds over several days leading up to the main event.

CAN CHILDREN ATTEND THE GRAND PRIX?

Yes, children are welcome at the Monaco Grand Prix, making it an exciting experience for the whole family. However, it's important to keep in mind that the race generates extremely loud engine noise, particularly given Monaco's narrow streets and the enclosed nature of the circuit.

To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for younger fans, it is strongly recommended to provide children with proper hearing protection, such as noise-canceling headphones or ear defenders.

WHAT TIPS DO YOU HAVE TO MAKE THE MOST OF THE GRAND PRIX?

It is highly advisable to arrive early to avoid the large crowds and secure a smooth entry to the event. Be sure to wear comfortable clothing and sturdy walking shoes, as navigating Monaco's hilly streets and busy areas can be challenging. Additionally, don't forget to bring sun protection, such as sunscreen, sunglasses, and a hat, since most seating areas are not shaded and the sun can be particularly intense. Staying hydrated throughout the day is also essential, so consider carrying a refillable water bottle to keep cool and comfortable.
